






## LOCATION

# THE HUNTING

While not being driven by filled game bags, the wingshooting is unrivaled. Equally as impressive is their desire to practice responsible conservation initiatives. Every day, they strive to ensure guests view their harvested quarry as an added bonus to the remarkable moments spent at camp and afield; for they are experiences surrounded by endless views, unique ecosystems, much laughter, and wild treasures.

Sharp-tailed Grouse and Pheasant are the primary birds of choice on the 10,000 acres of private land, but there are also opportunities for Hungarian Partridge. The season runs from the first of September through the first half of December.

#### SHARP-TAILED GROUSE

Montana is one of the few places where sharp-tailed grouse still thrive in large numbers. September and October are the best times to pursue these low-density birds in a highvolume area. They often popcorn flush in singles and pairs which can make for exciting wing shooting.


Sharp-Tails can still be pursued in late October and early November. Then the birds will move to thicker cover and we work closely with the pointers and flushers to get enough shots.

Expect to put in 8-12 miles a day to find the best points during these active hunts.

#### WATERFOWL

The main focus is low numbers of hunters and high-quality hunts. Here, it's all about the experience and small, private group setting to provide clients with amazing memories and world-class waterfowl all to themselves. The action-packed hunts focus primarily on field hunting and finishing a group of birds in the decoys.

What a pleasure it is to see how their philosophy and vision lead all they do while practicing a most meaningful value system afield that ensures our sporting traditions be here tomorrow.

#### PHEASANT

The pheasant hunting has an emphasis on quality dog work and tight-holding birds. A good time here is watching a pointer lock up or a flusher getting birdy and then tracking the bird down to the flush. When the dog brings back a three-year-old, long-tailed rooster that is just icing on the cake.

Pheasant hunting in Montana starts the second Saturday in October. The weather is always a bit unpredictable out west, but October will bring more moderate temperatures.

November and December provide very productive pheasant hunting. The birds are concentrated into the best covers and when you find them the shooting can be fast and furious. Temperatures are colder, but this time of year can produce some tremendous days afield. It is recommended to combine Pheasant and Waterfowl hunting to add a little diversity should you bag your limit in the first few hours of the hunt.
